

Privacy Notice - Trackable Products and Systems

Isle of Man Post Office - Controller

Isle of Man Post Office (IOMPO) is a controller for all personal data processed by the IOMPO, staff or other appointed Officers for the purposes of the General Data Protection Regulation (Isle of Man) Order 2018. The contact details for the IOMPO are Isle of Man Post Office, Postal Headquarters, Spring Valley Industrial Estate, Douglas, Isle of Man IM2 1AA.

In addition to the information set out in the IOMPO privacy notice, we may also collect the following information for sender and recipient:

- Name
- Full address
- Email address
- Phone numbers
- Signatures
- GPS for delivery point

How we will use the information we collect about you

IOMPO will use your information to:

- Take necessary steps to make sure your mail is delivered or returned to the sender
- To process collections and deliveries for account customers.
- Maintain a record of the transaction
- Processing payments and refunds for our services
- Providing delivery updates to the sender and the person the item was sent to, as part of our track and trace services.
- If you have accepted a parcel on behalf of someone else (such as your neighbour). This may include using your data to give your details to the sender and the person the item was sent to, to let them know you have the item, and allow the delivery to be properly tracked within the postal service
- Providing proof of postage or delivery
- Help prevent and detect crime including fraud, money laundering, identity theft or other criminal offences

This may include checks of publicly available information but in some cases, where it is necessary and relevant, the information you provide may be disclosed or shared with other organisations. This will only be done where there is a Compliance with legal obligation, a Contractual necessity, or processing for a new purposes or consent for us to do so.

- We will do this to allow us to undertake marketing to new and existing customers.
- Verify the information and documentation you have provided is correct
- Help prevent and detect crime including fraud, money laundering, identity theft or other criminal offences.

How we will share the information we collect about you

Third parties we may share your data with include, for example:

- Police or law enforcement agencies where there is a legal requirement to do so
- Courts on production of a valid court order
- Fraud prevention agencies
- When mailing items containing goods to outside of the UK, data is shared with Royal Mail, who then share this data with the CDS (Customs Declaration Service) and the recipient country of each item
- We share your personal data with our customers when we provide them with services which involve you. For example, if a customer has arranged for an item to be sent to you, we will give them delivery updates and proof that it has been delivered. This proof may confirm where we delivered the item and show any signature the person who received the item gave us.

- If you buy postage through an online shopping platform such as eBay or Amazon, or if we deliver items you have bought from them, we may share your personal data with them to provide updates on an item's location and proof of delivery.

Information obtained or disclosed by third parties will not be used for any other purpose other than to verify the information and documentation provided is correct

Protecting your information

Isle of Man Post Office will:

- keep your information safe and secure in compliance with its information security policy
- maintain security of the systems which hold personal data in line with ISO27001 standard
- only use and disclose your information as detailed above, where necessary
- only permit authorised staff to view your data
- retain the information for no longer than is necessary and your information will be permanently deleted once the timeframes set out below have been reached.

Transfer of information outside the EEA

Where we transfer your personal data outside the EEA, we will ensure that it is protected in a manner that is consistent with how your personal data will be protected by us in the EEA. This can be done in a number of ways, for instance:

- We will share your personal data with overseas postal authorities and carriers. If you are sending a letter or parcel overseas or receiving an item from overseas, we will provide the information required for customs and tax purposes or for security screening. This information will normally include:
 - the sender's name and address
 - the name and address, plus phone number if given of the recipient, and
 - details of the item's contents.
- IOMPO has signed up to Data Sharing agreements with worldwide postal administrators through the Universal Postal Union.
- the country that we send the data to might be approved by the European Commission or a relevant data protection authority;
- the recipient might have signed up to a contract based on "model contractual clauses" approved by the European Commission, obliging them to protect your personal data.

In other circumstances the law may permit us to otherwise transfer your personal data outside the EEA. In all cases, however, we will ensure that any transfer of your personal data is compliant with data protection law.
