## CN22 Customs Declaration Explained

## From Friday 1st January 2021, the requirement for accurate customs documentation for items containing goods sent to Rest of World addresses will also apply to European destinations and the Channel Islands.

The changes are mandated by the Universal Postal Union (UPU) and the World Customs Organisation (WCO). When mailing items containing goods to outside of the UK, you will need to accurately complete and sign a customs declaration. A CN22 should be used when sending items valued at less than £270, for items with a value higher than this a CN23 should be used.
